This book is a window into the life and times of our beloved Prophet Muhammad ﷺ.

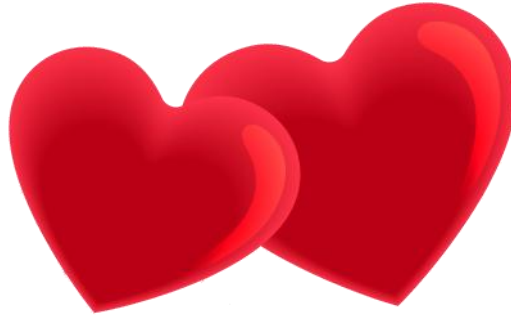

AAMINAH & ABDULLAH

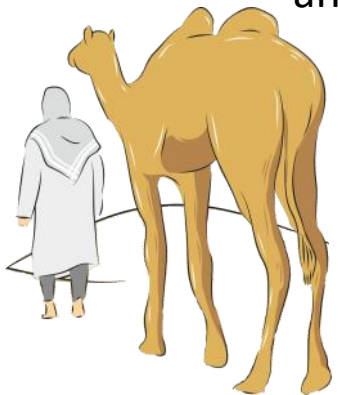
Our story begins when a wonderful young lady called Aaminah was getting married.

They would bring these goods back with them to sell in Makkah.

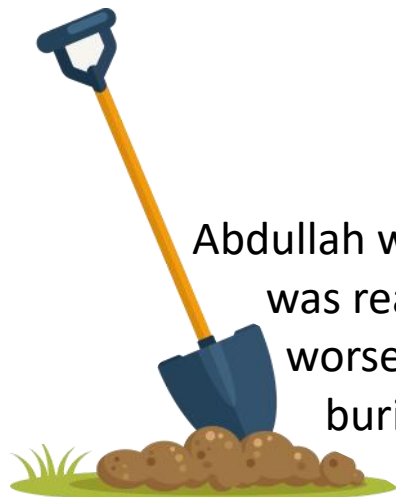
People used to travel on camels. They would use the camels to carry their goods. Groups travelling like this were called caravans. It would take a caravan weeks to travel to Syria and back.

Everyone was overjoyed and they took the baby boy to his grandfather, Abdul Muttalib.

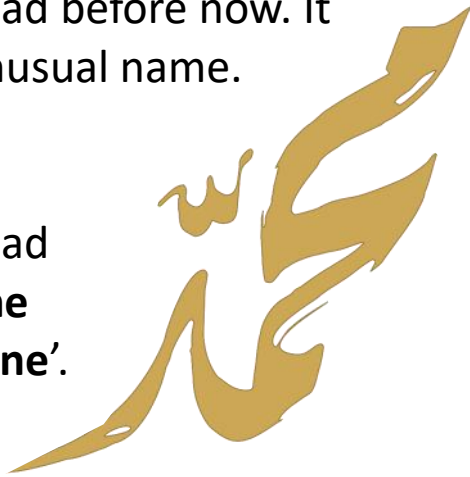


Abdul Muttalib was at the Ka'bah at the time. He was so happy and named his new grandson, Muhammad ﷺ.

Both of these qualities were found in Muhammad ﷺ.



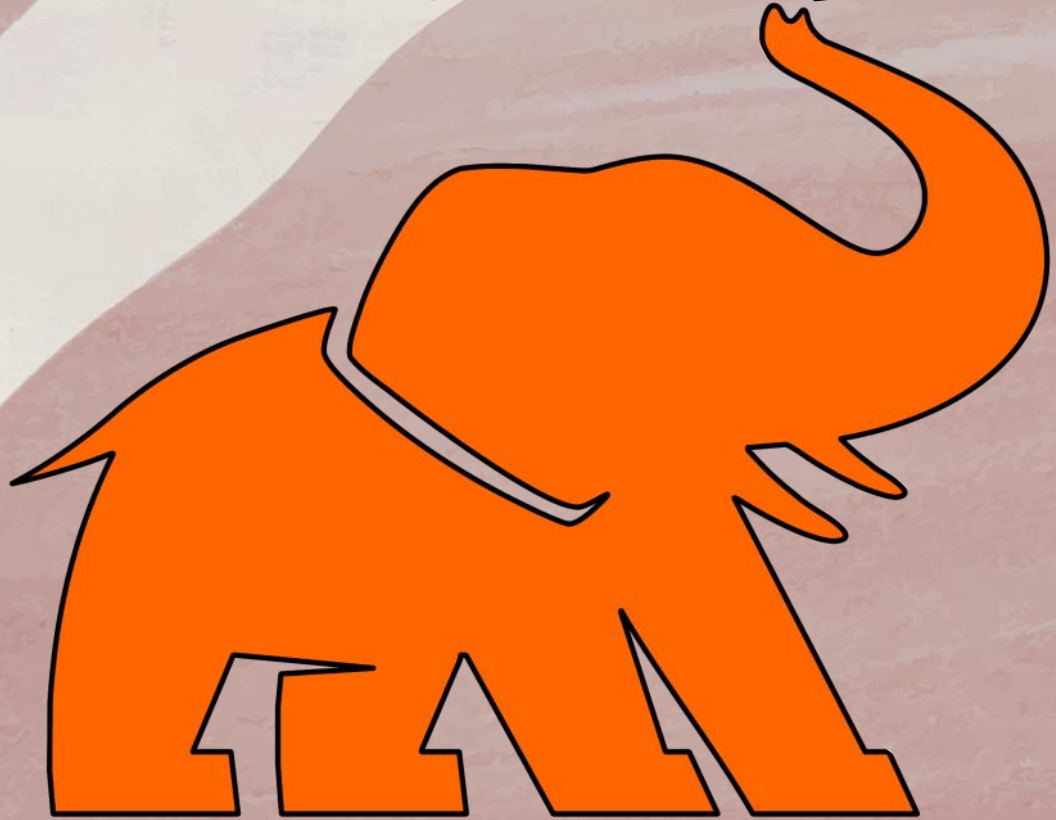
Makkah was on the caravan trade route between Yemen and Syria. It became a very busy and wealthy city.

Abraha gave Abdul Muttalib his camels back.

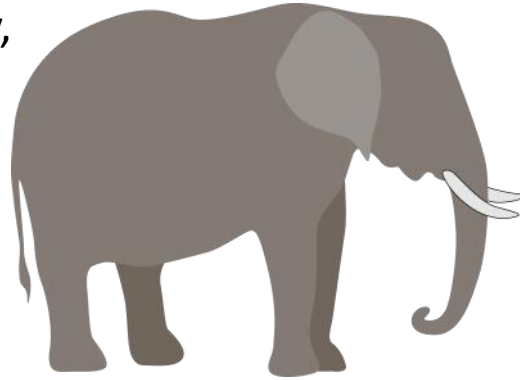


The Makkans went to the mountains for safety. They could not fight such a big army. They could not defend the Ka’bah.

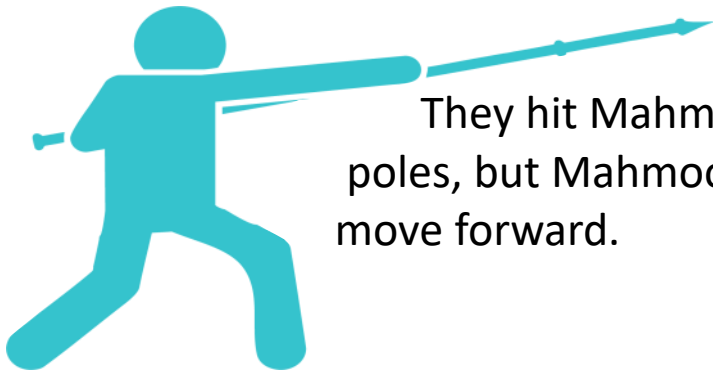


Abraha decided that it was time to march towards the Ka’bah and destroy it.

He would happily go in any other direction. As soon as they would turn him towards the Ka'bah, he would stop!



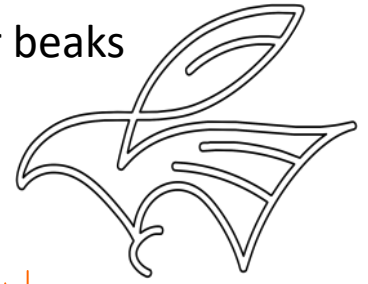
They hit Mahmood with metal poles, but Mahmood would not move forward.

They poked him with spikes, but Mahmood would not move forward.

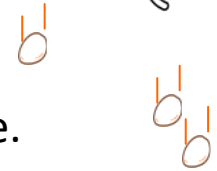


Then suddenly, Allah sent a flock of birds towards the army.

Halimah Sa'diyyah loved her foster children. She cared for them. She fed and clothed them.

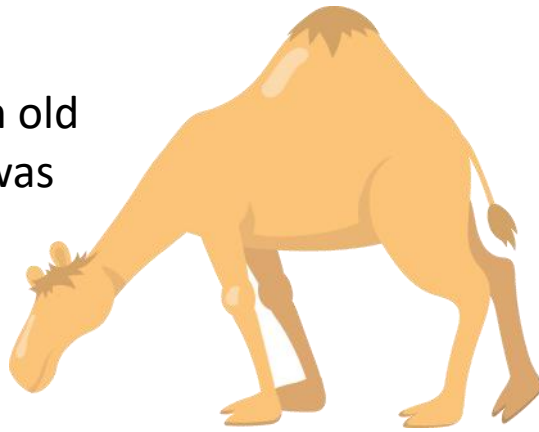


After two years, the babies would be returned to their mums and dads.

The foster mums had not taken Muhammad ﷺ because his dad was not alive.

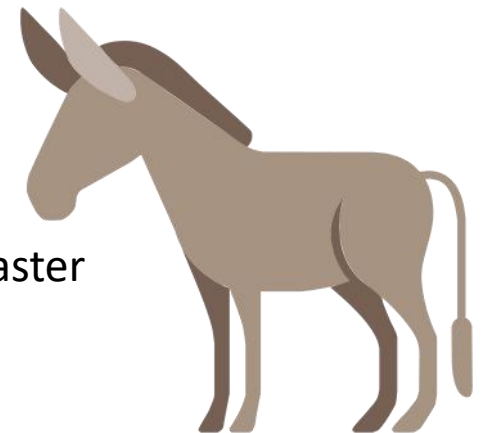
Aaminah was not very rich, so the bedouins thought they wouldn't get much money for their hard work.

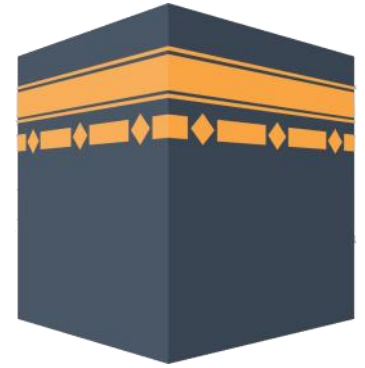
Halimah's son saw this and was very scared. He ran to Halimah Sa'diyyah and told her what had happened.



Halimah was also frightened and quickly took Muhammad ﷺ back to Aaminah.

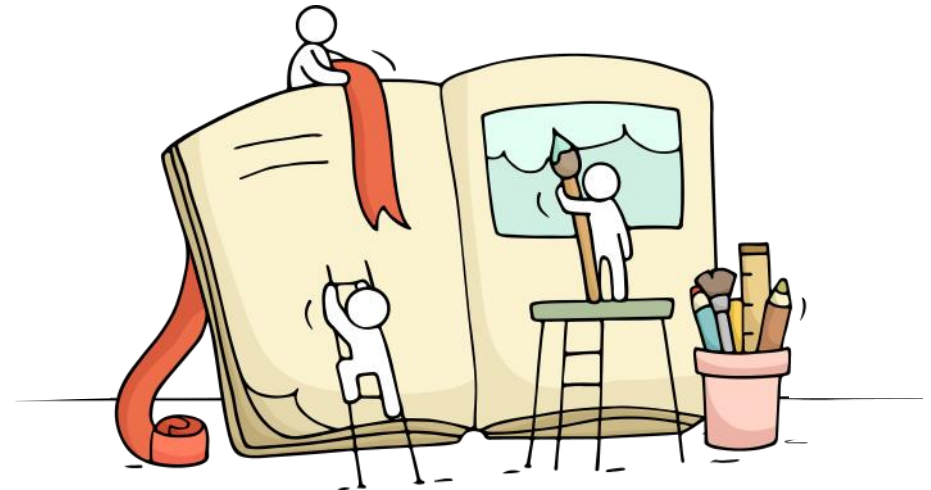
She told Aaminah what had happened. Aaminah replied, "**Muhammad ﷺ is very special. Nothing bad will happen to him.**"

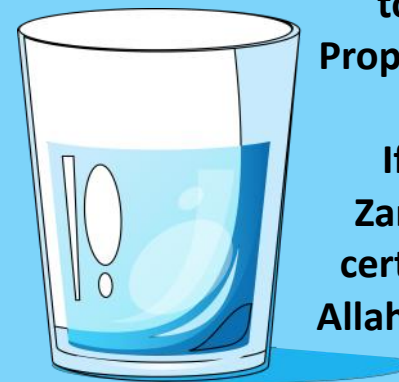

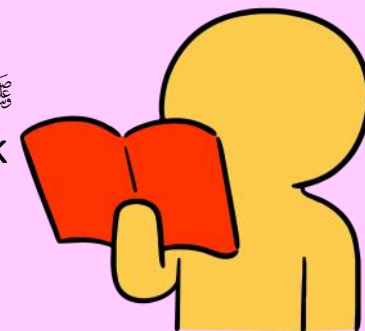

Muhammad ﷺ was fond of his grandfather. They spent a lot of time together. Abdul Muttalib knew Muhammad ﷺ was special.

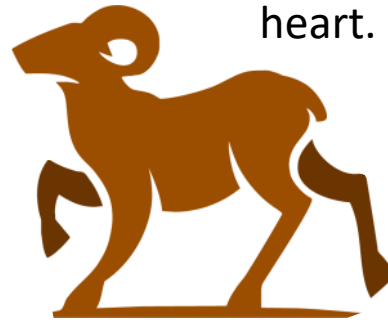

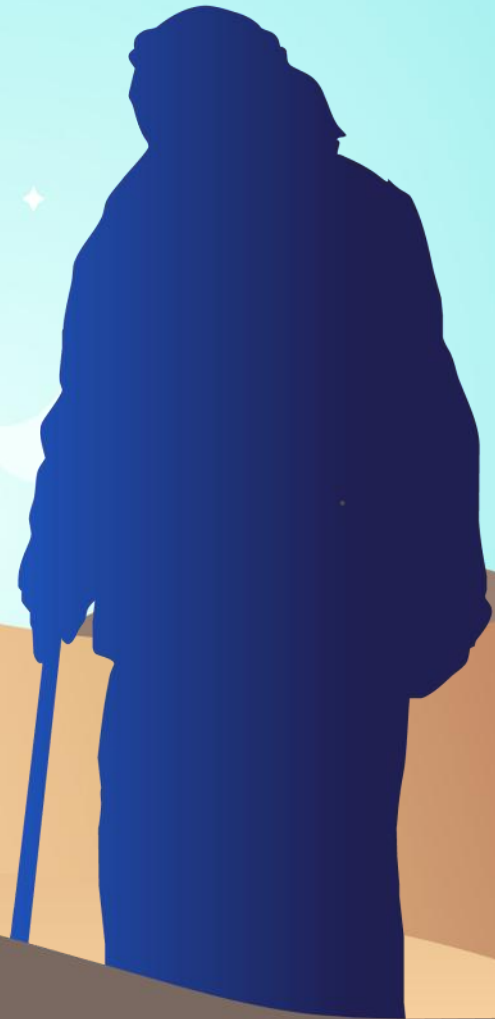
Abdul Muttalib would seat the Prophet ﷺ on the couch beside him. He would say that Muhammad ﷺ would have a special future!

Bahira had read about a special person in his books. He read that this special person would pass by this very place. Perhaps this is why Bahira lived here.

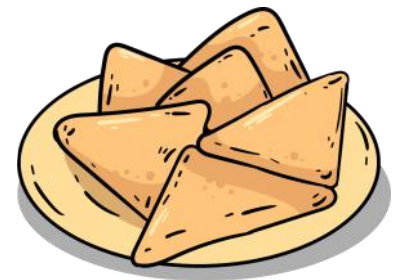


He quickly got some food together. He sent a message to the caravan, inviting them to come and visit him.

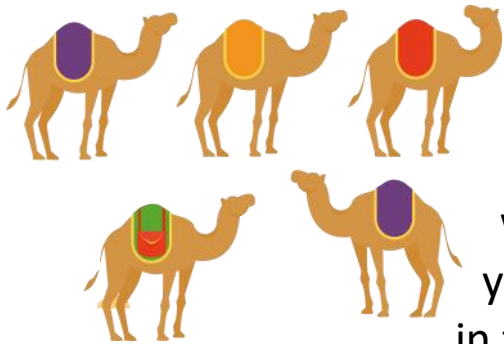


The caravan was Abu Talib's. They accepted this generous offer and went to Bahira's monastery.

As the people from the caravan sat down, Bahira looked at their faces. He couldn't see the person he was looking for.

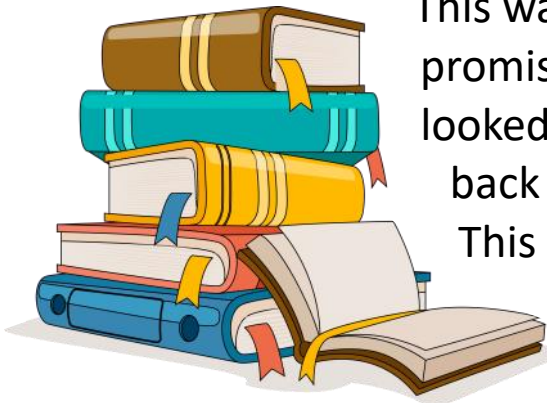


Bahira asked one of the people from the caravan if anyone was missing from the group. He was told that one of the youngsters was left outside to look after the camels.

Bahira was worried. He thought that if someone else recognises Muhammad ﷺ they might try to harm him.

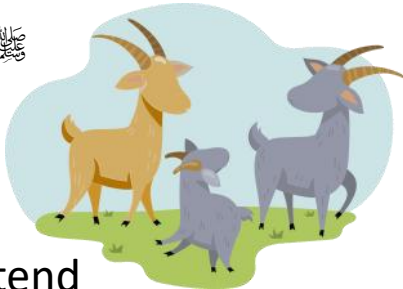


Bahira told Abu Talib that Muhammad ﷺ was not safe here. He advised Abu Talib to take Muhammad ﷺ back to Makkah.

Whilst on the journey, Allah sent a cloud to shade the Prophet ﷺ from the heat of the sun.

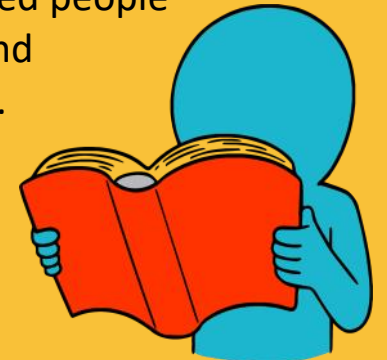


>> Syria was an important trade centre. People would travel from all over the world to buy and sell there.

The caravan had returned to Makkah. Khadijah was pleased with Muhammad ﷺ. She had made a lot more money with this caravan than before.

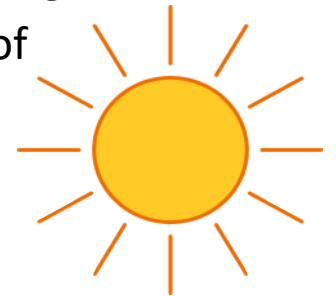


She was especially happy with Muhammad's ﷺ good manners, honesty and sincerity.

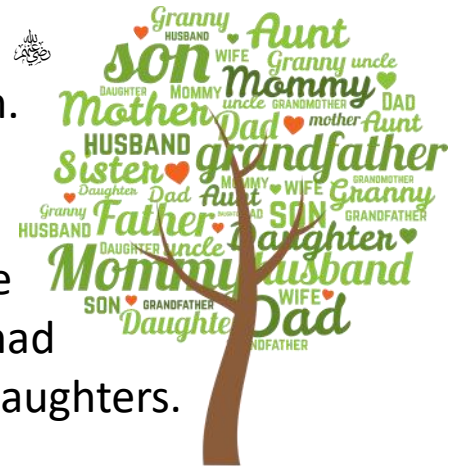
Khadijah's ﷺ uncle and Abu Talib met. They spoke with each other and made all the arrangements.

REBUILDING THE KA'BAH

They collected funds for the huge task of rebuilding the Ka'bah.

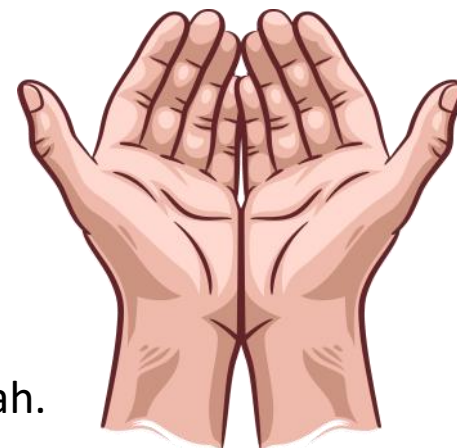
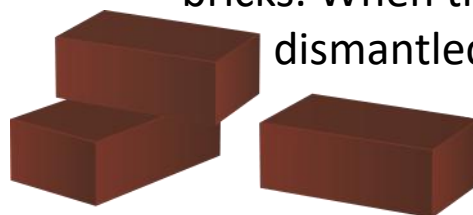


The Ka'bah was the house of Allah. They wanted to use money that was earned in a good and pure way. They did not accept money earned through stealing, robbery, or any other wrong way.

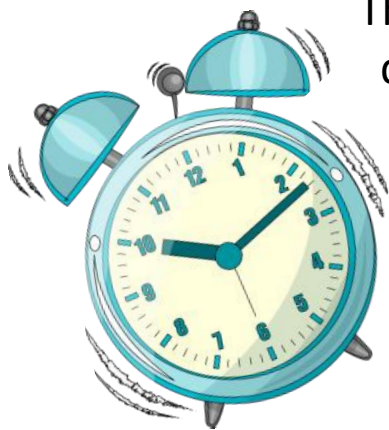
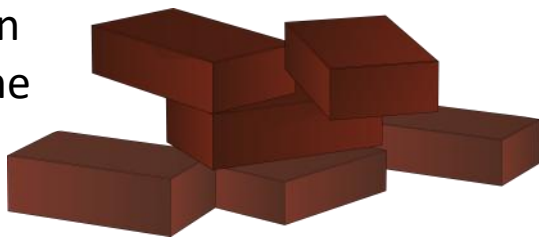
The time had now come to rebuild the Ka'bah and the first step was to demolish the walls.

The next morning Waleed continued to demolish the Ka'bah. Soon everyone joined in.

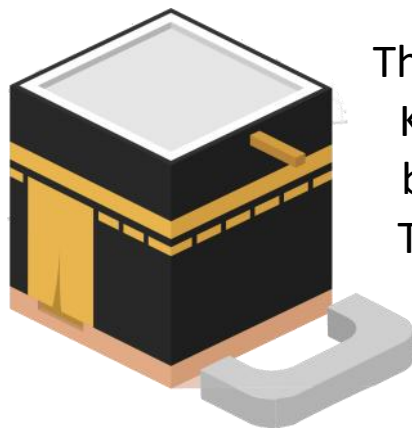
The people demolished the Ka'bah, and now it was time to rebuild it.

Finally, someone suggested that the next person to enter the Haram should decide who should put the Black Stone back in its place.

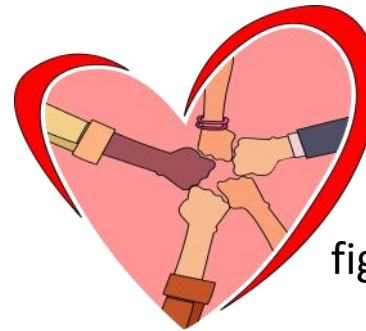

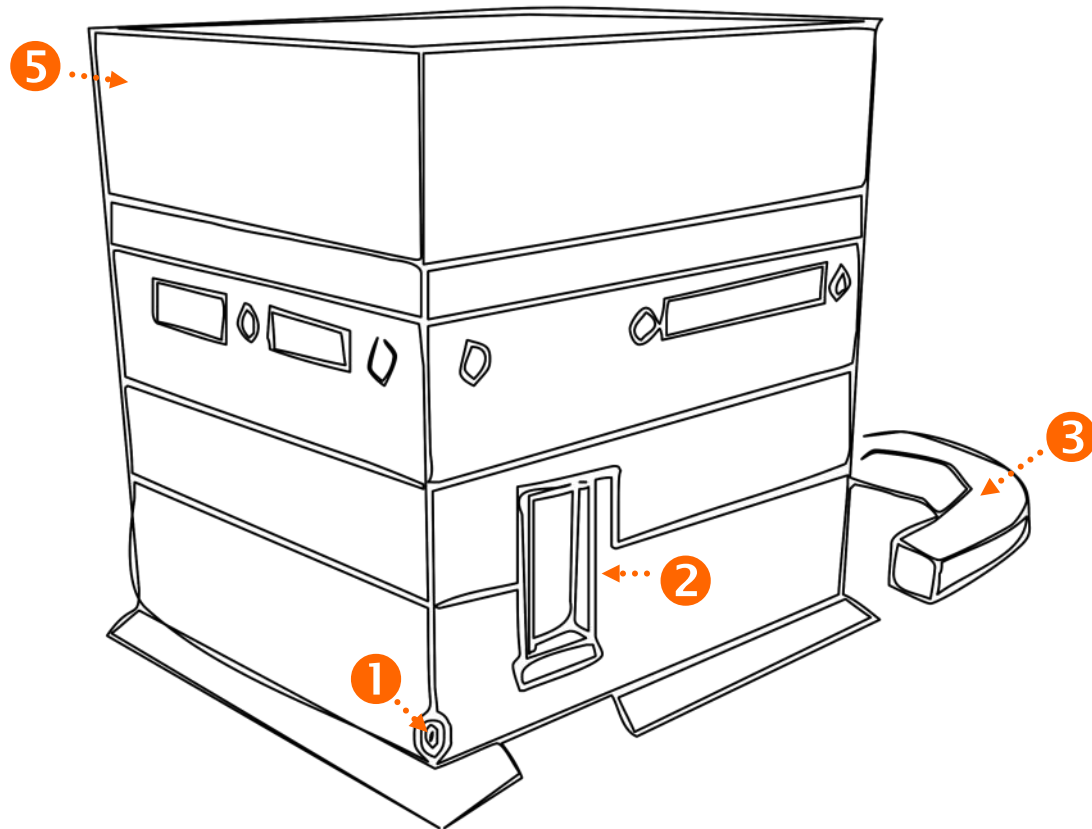

The First Verses

THE FIRST VERSES

Muhammad ﷺ would often spend a few nights in Cave Hira. From there he could see the Ka'bah in the distance. He would sit in the cave and think about life.



It was the month of Ramadhan. Muhammad ﷺ climbed Mount Noor and went into Cave Hira. He sat there as he usually would, but this time it was different.

Muhammad ﷺ was alone, when a person appeared in the cave! This person was actually Angel Jibra'il ﷺ in the form of a man.

Angel Jibra'il ﷺ said to Muhammad ﷺ, "**Iqra!**" This means 'Read!' in Arabic.



Muhammad ﷺ did not go to school. He did not know how to read or write. In fact, in those days, very few people knew how to read or write.



Muhammad ﷺ replied, "**I can't read!**" Angel Jibra'il ﷺ took hold of Muhammad ﷺ and squeezed him tight. It was so tight that Muhammad ﷺ thought he would pass out.



The angel again said, "**Iqra!**" and Muhammad ﷺ again replied, "**I can't read!**"

The angel ﷺ squeezed Muhammad ﷺ again.

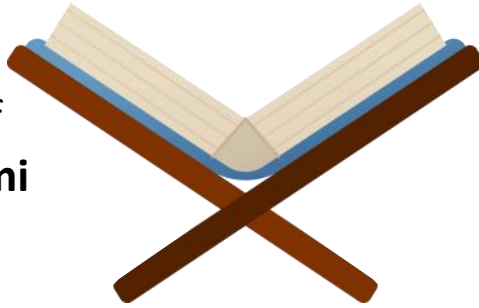
Then, for the third time, he said to Muhammad ﷺ, "**Iqra!**" and again, for the third time, Muhammad ﷺ replied, "**I can't read!**"



Angel Jibra'il ﷺ squeezed Muhammad ﷺ for a third time.

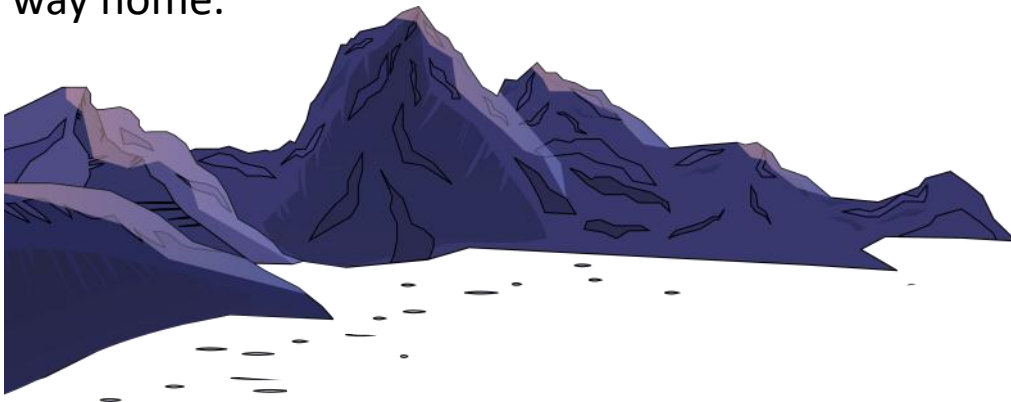
He squeezed him so tight that Muhammad ﷺ found it hard to breathe.

The angel then recited the first five verses revealed of the Holy Qur'an, "**Iqra bismi rabbika...**"



When Muhammad ﷺ heard these verses, he repeated them after Angel Jibra'il ﷺ. These beautiful words were in his heart forever.

When Angel Jibra'il ﷺ disappeared, Prophet Muhammad ﷺ ran out of the cave. He started running down Mount Noor, and soon he was on his way home.



As Muhammad ﷺ was returning home, he heard a voice coming from above him. He looked up to see where the voice was coming from.



When Muhammad ﷺ looked up, he saw Jibra'il ﷺ again. This time Jibra'il ﷺ was not in the form of a man, but in his natural form. He was huge and had 600 wings!

Jibra'il ﷺ said, "**O Muhammad ﷺ! You are the messenger of Allah, and I am Jibra'il.**"

Muhammad ﷺ ran back home to Khadijah ﷺ and asked her to wrap him up. He was out of breath and shivering.



Muhammad ﷺ was worried and told Khadijah ؓ about everything that happened.

Khadijah ؓ reminded him that he was a very good person. He was always helpful and very generous to people. She said that Allah would never let anything bad happen to him.



Khadijah ؓ took Muhammad ﷺ to see her cousin, Waraqah ibn Nawfal. Waraqah was an old man who knew about the previous scriptures and books.

Waraqah carefully listened to what had happened with Muhammad ﷺ. Waraqah told Muhammad ﷺ that he had in fact seen the same angel that was sent to the other prophets.

Waraqah said that Muhammad ﷺ had been chosen as a prophet of Allah. He said that if he was younger, he would have joined Muhammad ﷺ and supported him.

Waraqah warned Muhammad ﷺ that the people would chase him out of Makkah. He said that the people of every prophet gave their prophet a difficult time.

The Early Muslims

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ told his family and friends about Islam. He said to them that Allah is One. He said to them that worshipping idols is wrong.



Muhammad ﷺ explained to them that Allah had chosen him to be a prophet and messenger. Allah wanted him to guide mankind.

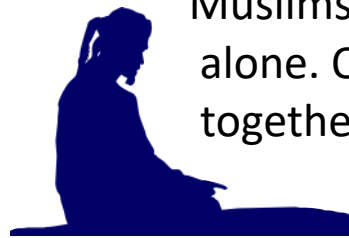

Muhammad's ﷺ close family and friends accepted Islam. They became Muslims.

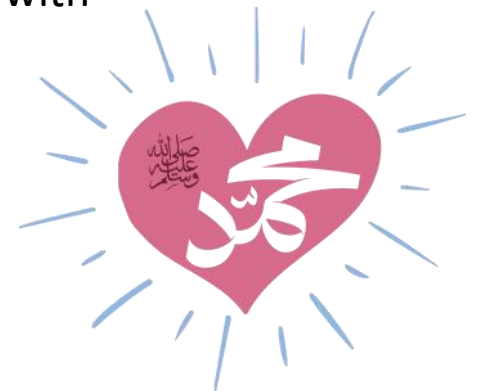
The Angel Jibra'il ﷺ would visit Muhammad ﷺ. He would sometimes bring verses from the Qur'an.

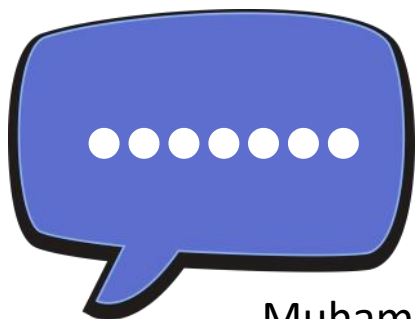
Once when Jibra'il ﷺ came to visit Muhammad ﷺ, Jibra'il ﷺ struck a rock with his heel and water began to gush from the rock. Jibra'il ﷺ taught Muhammad ﷺ how to do wudhu with this water. He then taught Muhammad ﷺ how to perform Salah.



Muslims would sometimes perform salah alone. Other times they would get together to perform salah in secret.

Abu Talib saw Muhammad ﷺ and the Muslims praying. He became pleased with Muhammad ﷺ. He loved Muhammad ﷺ very much, but sadly Abu Talib did not accept Islam. He did not want to leave the religion of his forefathers.





Allah commanded His Prophet, Muhammad ﷺ, to start calling everyone to Islam. This was a big step.

Until now, the Prophet

Muhammad ﷺ had only told his close family and friends about Islam. Until now, the Muslims had kept their religion a secret.

At the Prophet's ﷺ time, when anyone had to warn the Makkans about something, they would climb up Mount Safa. They would shout out to the Makkans to tell them about the danger.



Muhammad ﷺ climbed up Mount Safa. He called out to the Makkans. The Makkans began to gather around to listen to Muhammad ﷺ.

Muhammad ﷺ asked, “If I told you that there is an army behind this mountain ready to attack you, would you believe me?”



The Makkans used to call Muhammad ﷺ **Al-Saadiq** (Truthful) and **Al-Ameen** (the trustworthy). They knew that Muhammad ﷺ would never lie so they all replied, “Yes! We would.”



The Prophet Muhammad ﷺ warned the Makkans about Allah's punishment. He told them to accept Islam and to save themselves. Everyone became quiet. There was silence.



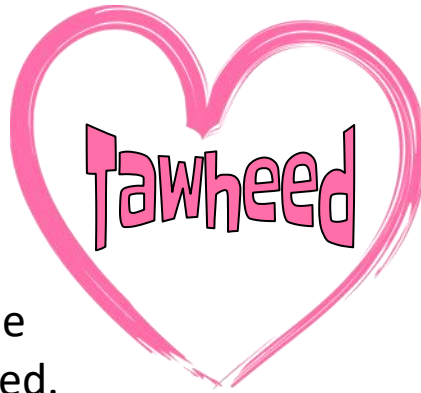
Abu Lahab was another uncle of Prophet Muhammad ﷺ. Abu Lahab broke the silence by saying bad things to our Prophet ﷺ.



This made Allah angry, and Surah Lahab was revealed about Abu Lahab's punishment in the Hereafter.

» Bilal Habshi ﷺ

Bilal ﷺ was one person the message did reach. He was a slave and when he heard the message of Islam and about the oneness of Allah, he was amazed.



The message touched his heart and he immediately knew that this was the truth. His heart told him that Muhammad ﷺ was the messenger of Allah.



Bilal's ﷺ master was a wicked man. He was very angry with him when he found out that Bilal ﷺ had accepted Islam.

He would hurt him in the most horrible ways, hoping that Bilal ﷺ would leave Islam.

Bilal ﷺ loved Islam and Allah. He would never leave the truth and he would never worship idols. Even at the hardest times, Bilal ﷺ would say, "Ahad, Ahad..." Allah is one.



It was hard for the Muslims to see Bilal ﷺ suffering so much. The generous Abu Bakr ﷺ purchased Bilal ﷺ and set him free.

Many other slaves and poor people suffered in the same way. There were people in Makkah who did not want Islam to succeed. They worked very hard to hurt the Muslims and stop people entering Islam.

» Hamzah ibn Abdul Muttalib ﷺ

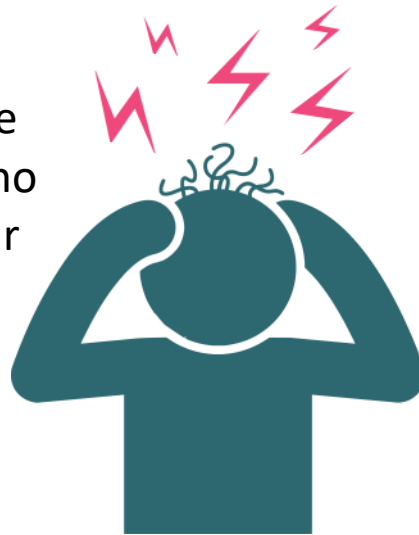
Hamzah ﷺ was an uncle of Prophet Muhammad ﷺ. The Makkans respected Hamzah ﷺ. He was strong and very brave.

This really upset Hamzah رضي الله عنه. He went straight to Abu Lahab, who was sitting with his friends near the Ka'bah. Hamzah رضي الله عنه used his bow and hit him across the head with all his might.



Abu Lahab's friends were horrified but knew better than to cross paths with Hamzah رضي الله عنه. Abu Lahab also did not say anything because he knew that he was wrong to treat Muhammad صلى الله عليه وسلم so badly.

Hamzah رضي الله عنه told them there and then that he was now a Muslim.

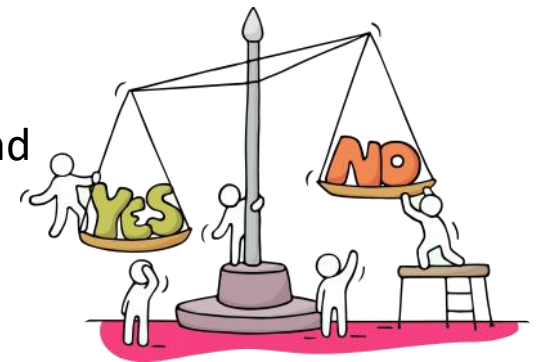
Hamzah رضي الله عنه became a great Muslim who dedicated his life to being a good person and following Islam fully in his life.

He was also very clever and could be one of the kindest and fairest people in Makkah.

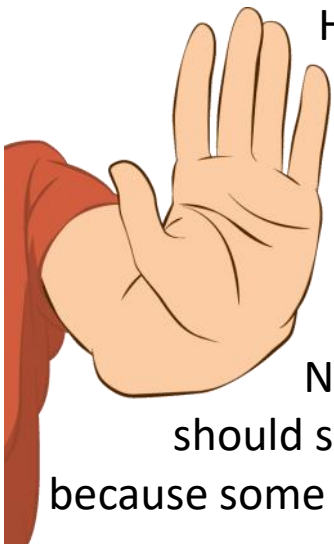


One day, Umar رضي الله عنه was angry. In fact, he was very angry! He didn't want things to change in Makkah.

He didn't care that people worshipped idols. After all, his tribe had been worshipping idols for many generations!



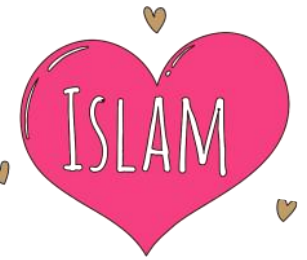
He took his sword and was marching down the street. People knew to keep out of his way. Someone was in big trouble.



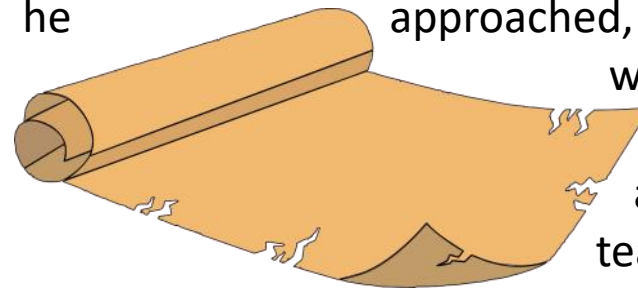

Nu'aym suggested that maybe he should sort his own family out first, because some of them had become Muslims.

Umar رضي الله عنه didn't know that his own sister had become a Muslim and that she now loved Islam more than anything else.



Umar رضي الله عنه marched to his sister Fatimah's house. As he approached, he heard some words being recited.



It was Khabbab ibn al-Arat رضي الله عنه who was teaching them some verses of the Qur'an.

As Umar رضي الله عنه knocked on the door, Khabbab رضي الله عنه found a place to hide, whilst Fatimah رضي الله عنها hid the pages.

THE HAJJ



Prophet Ibrahim عليه السلام had built the Ka'bah for people to only worship Allah. Prophet Ibrahim عليه السلام had also invited the people to make the Hajj.

From his time, people had been coming to Makkah for Hajj. So, for many centuries, people had made this sacred journey to Makkah.

However, the Makkans had put 360 idols in and around the Ka'bah for people to worship. When people came for Hajj, they worshipped the idols as well as Allah.



Muhammad ﷺ had warned the Makkans that this was wrong and that Allah will be angry with them.

It was almost Hajj time and many people would be coming to Makkah. The Makkans did not want people to find out about Islam. They had a meeting to stop the people from learning about Islam.



People would come from far and wide to worship the idols. Through the Hajj, the Makkans were held in high respect and they also made lots of money.

The Makkans were worried that if people stopped worshipping idols, they would lose their wealth and status.

They thought about what they could say that would stop the people from listening to Muhammad ﷺ.



Some Makkans said that we should tell the people that Muhammad ﷺ is telling lies. However, everyone knew that Muhammad ﷺ was the most truthful person.



Some Makkans suggested that we can tell the people that Muhammad ﷺ is using magic words. But they also knew that was not true, and that Muhammad ﷺ was not a magician!

Others suggested that they could tell the people that Muhammad ﷺ is a poet and not a prophet. However, they knew that Muhammad ﷺ had never made a poem in his life!



Deep down, many Makkans knew that Muhammad ﷺ really was a prophet of Allah.



They thought of as many lies as they could. They wanted to trick the people that came for Hajj!



Finally, they decided that they would wait at the outskirts of Makkah and speak to the people as they came. They would warn them that Muhammad ﷺ used magic words.

They would say that the words were dangerous, so don't listen to them.

They hoped that this would scare the people and they would keep away from Muhammad ﷺ.





When people came to Makkah, they heard all these lies about Muhammad ﷺ. Many of them were scared to listen to him.

» Tufayl ibn Amr رضى الله عنه

Tufayl ibn Amr رضى الله عنه heard all the stories on his way to Makkah. He was a poet and was scared to listen to Muhammad ﷺ. He blocked his ears with bits of cloth so that he would not hear Muhammad ﷺ.

When he saw Muhammad ﷺ praying, he heard a faint few words of the Qur'an. He liked what he heard and became very curious.



He decided that he would listen to Muhammad ﷺ and would not be afraid.

He followed Muhammad ﷺ and then asked him about Islam.

Muhammad ﷺ told him about Islam and Tufayl ibn Amr رضى الله عنه accepted Islam.



Many people learned about Islam in Makkah. A lot of them became Muslims during this Hajj.

The Makkans were not happy. They still couldn't understand why so many people were still accepting Islam.

As you can imagine, the Makkans were not happy with the spread of Islam. They had tried so many different ways to stop people following Islam.



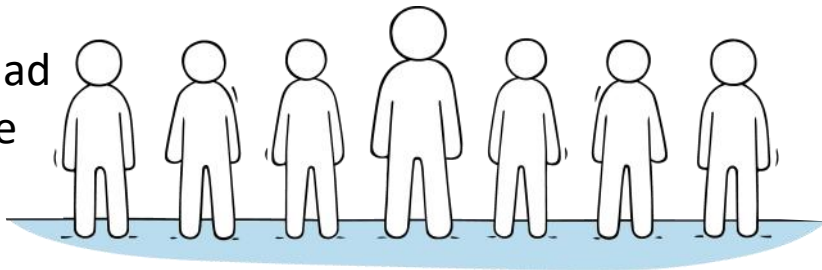
They had tried so many things to stop people listening to our beloved Prophet ﷺ.

Muhammad ﷺ was a prophet of Allah. His mission was to spread the truth and always stand up for the truth. He naturally refused all their offers.

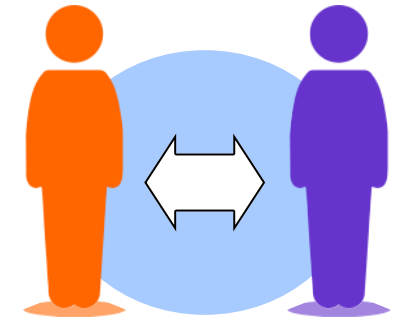
They even offered to worship Allah for one year and then worship the idols the next.

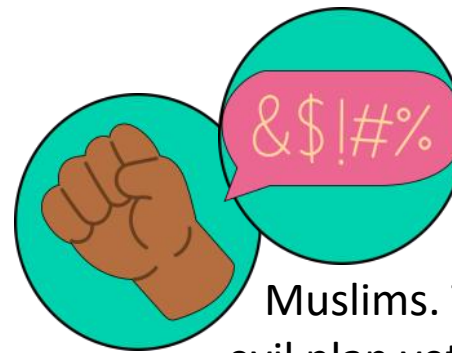
Muhammad ﷺ said No! How could he do such an evil thing as worshipping Idols? There is no compromise in tawheed.

The Makkans, were not finished yet. They continued their bullying and cruel behaviour against the Muslims. They were making their most evil plan yet.

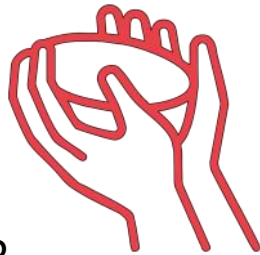


The tribes of Makkah got together and decided that they would boycott the Muslims.

Allah revealed Surah al-Kafiroon when the Makkans wanted the Muslims to worship idols for one year.

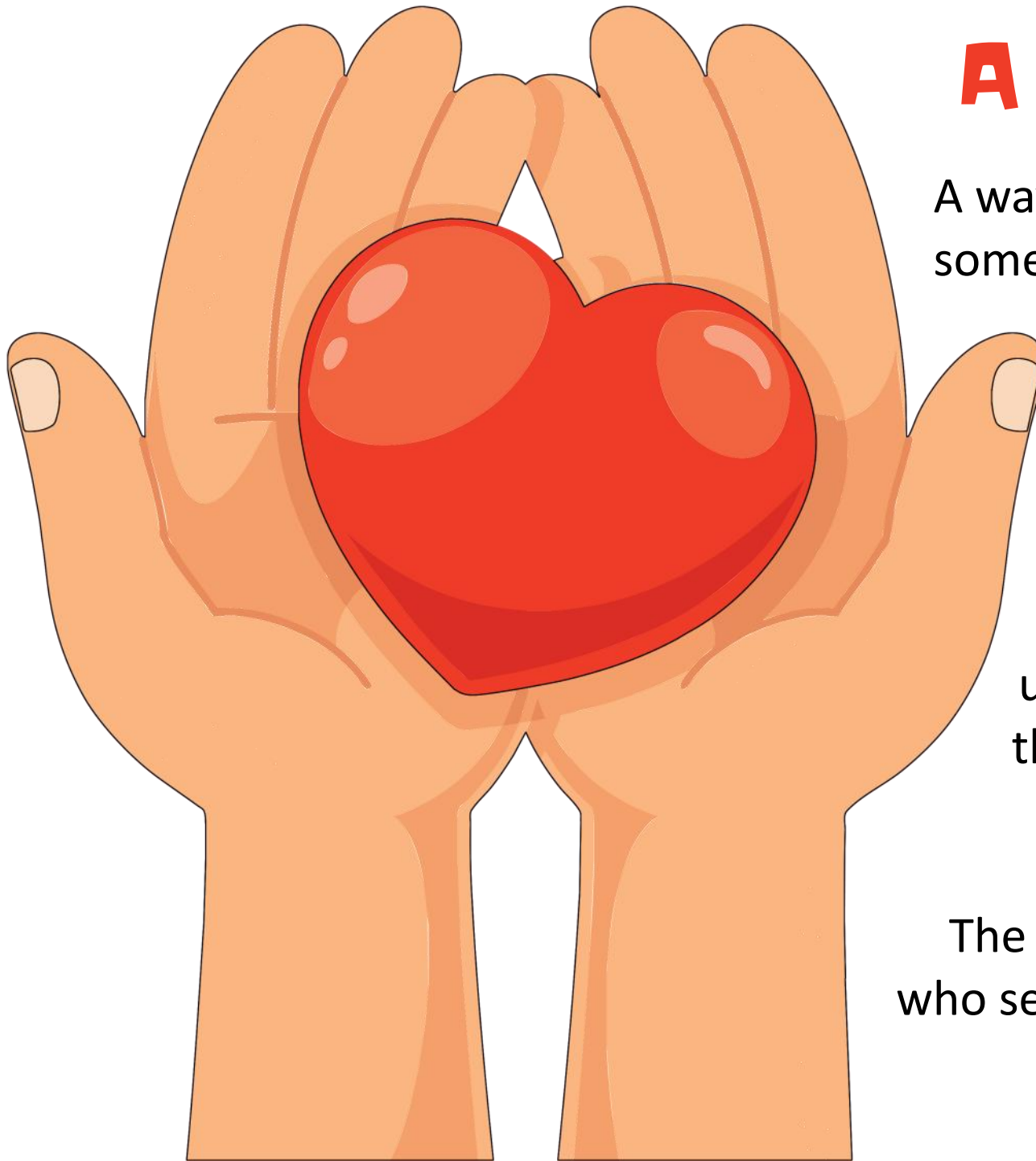
In this surah, Allah shows us that we must **never** worship anybody or anything except Allah. We must stay away from other kinds of worship!

On 12th Rabi Al-Awwal, 571CE a momentous event took place which changed the course of world history.
